The Androscoggin Valley ATV Club (AVATV Club) is comprised of over 100 ATV, UTV and Trail bike enthusiasts. We have developed and are currently managing and maintaining 14 miles of the 22 mile Success Trail. In addition, Club volunteers are assisting the NH Bureau of Trails in the development and maintaining of the Jericho Mt. State Park trail system.

Since the Club's inception in 2000, the Success Trail has had 6 new bridges constructed and the trail has been enlarged to a 14' wide corridor to accommodate snowmobile grooming equipment the during winter month's. The major source of funding for the Success and Jericho trail systems has come from the RTP Grant. Since the start of trail construction at Jericho Mt. State Park in 2006, AVATV Club volunteers have logged more than 3000 hours assisting the Bureau of Trails in construction and maintenance. The AVATV Club will be able to meet the timelines form project completion.

In November of 2009, thru a combined effort of the City of Berlin, the Berlin Police Department, NH Bureau of trails and the AVATV Club, a 4 mile cross town trail was opened connecting the Jericho and Success trail systems. The opening of this trail enables riders to access both trail systems from any of the three parking locations along with access to down town services.

In 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 the Club has played a major role in organizing the popular Jericho ATV Festival held at Jericho Mt. State Park attracting ATV/UTV enthusiasts from near and far to enjoy the State Park and surrounding trails.

The AVATV Club has limited financial ability to make initial payments for grant costs. We will be making a request for a working capital advance of funds.

The Success Trail project will be the restoration of the existing OHRV trail. The Success Trail is a vital link in the Ride The Wilds trail system, thus it sees very heavy OHRV usage during the snowless months and it also is used as a snowmobile trail during the winter and is groomed by the Bureau of Trails. The work will focus on sections in the first 4 miles of the trail unless other trail damage occurs. The majority of work will be accomplished using a rented excavator including a skilled operator. Manual labor including installing trail signs, brush removal, removal of blown down trees and removal other obstacles along the trail will be performed by AVATV Club volunteers. The project will cost \$18,750.00. The Club is requesting \$15,000.00 from RTP for excavator rental. The Club will match \$1,875 in volunteer labor and \$1,875.00 in cash towards excavator rental and permits. The AVATV Club remains committed to assisting the NH Bureau of Trails with the management and maintenance of the Success and Jericho trail systems in Berlin, NH.




