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Q U I T C L A I M KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

THAT, The State of New Hampshire, whose mailing address is Department of Transportation, 1 Hazen Drive, P.O. Box 483, Concord, NH 03302-0483, pursuant to RSA 4:40 and RSA 228:67, for considerations paid, to it in hand before the delivery hereof, from the Town of Enfield, a municipal corporation, with an address of 23 Main Street, Enfield, NH 03748, has remised, released and forever QUITCLAIMED, and by these presents, does remise, release and forever quitclaim unto said Town of Enfield, its successors, and assigns forever, subject to the conditions of this deed:

Any and all interest the State of New Hampshire has in a tract of land, which is part of the Northern Railroad corridor, now owned by the State of New Hampshire, in the Town of Enfield bounded and described as follows:

Being a portion of the Northern Railroad corridor as shown on Railroad Valuation Sheet V32.1/61 and nearly opposite Engineering Station 3182+50, on file in the records of the Department of Transportation's Bureau of Rail and Transit; bounded on the northeast by a line measured forty-one and twenty-five hundredths (41.25) feet southwesterly of and parallel with the center line of track of said railroad; bounded on the northwest by the Enfield/Lebanon town/city line; bounded on the south and by the Mascoma Lake shore line to a point on the southerly right-of-way line of said railroad nearly opposite Engineering Station 3179+00 and containing one and ninety-five hundredths (1.95) acres, more or less.

The Town of Enfield acknowledges and accepts the following: 1) The Northern Railroad corridor may be reactivated for rail service and the State of New Hampshire, lessee, successors or assigns reserves the right to restore rail service without compensation of any kind to the Town of Enfield. 2) In the event that rail service is reactivated on the Northern Railroad corridor, an atgrade highway crossing with active protection may be required at Johnson Road, so-called, including but not limited to lights and gates, as may be required by law as enacted or modified from time to time. The Town of Enfield and/or other property owners with rights under this deed will be responsible for all costs of construction and maintenance of the at-grade highway crossing with active protection. No other access would be permitted across the Northern Railroad corridor. 3) During the interim, the Northern Railroad corridor will be but not limited to non-motorized recreational use and snowmobile use in accordance with RSA 216-F. 4) The Town of Enfield will grant to the current owners of the buildings located on this parcel a life estate or similar arrangement with the right to remain on their respective sub-parcels.

Excepting and Reserving to the State of New Hampshire and the Water Resources Council its successors and assigns the right to flow water onto said property being conveyed to the Town of Enfield to an elevation of 754.00 U.S.G.S.

Meaning and intending to convey a portion of that railroad corridor conveyed by the Boston and Maine Corporation to the State of New Hampshire by Release Deed, dated July 5, 1995, and recorded in the Grafton County Register of Deeds on July 15, 1995 in Book 2149 Pages 254 - 260.

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TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging to the Town of Enfield, its successors and assigns forever.
